# Guest Speaker: State Rep. Wendy McNamara (District 76) Saturday @ 1:00—2:00 pm in the Belvedere Room



State Representative Wendy McNamara represents Indiana House District 76, which includes portions of Posey and Vanderburgh counties. She was born and raised in Indiana and received her undergraduate degree in Political Science from the University of Indianapolis, teacher certification from Valparaiso University and Masters in Education and Educational Leadership from the University of Southern Indiana.

Rep. McNamara brings many years of experience, knowledge and leadership to the Indiana House of Representatives with her educational career spanning more than 20 years with the Evansville Vanderburgh School Corporation. She served as a Teacher and Department Chair at Benjamin Bosse High School and at Harrison High School, as the Supervisor of Social Studies and as the Assistant Principal at North High School.

Currently, she serves as the Director of Early College High School. This is a position she has truly been innovative in by developing a model for high school students who simultaneously earn both a high school diploma and an Associate's degree or two years of college credit toward a Bachelor's degree.

She has served as an adjunct professor for World History at the University of Southern Indiana and has taught Political Science and Social Studies Methods at the University of Evansville. Rep. McNamara served as Constitution Coordinator for the Indiana Congressional District 8 'We the People' and as an Executive Board Member for the Indiana Association for Supervision and Curriculum Development (IASCD).

Through her dedication and passion for education, she has earned many prestigious awards. In 2009, Rep. McNamara received the Lawrence Senesh Award for School Administrators from the Indiana Council for Economic Education. She has been the Who's Who Among America's Teachers for years, 2004, 2005 and 2006.

She was the nominee for the Evansville Courier and University Evansville High School Teacher of the Year for the 2004-2005 school year and as a finalist for the 2002-2003 school year. Rep. McNamara was the Bosse Teacher of the Year for the 2001-2002 school year and received the Indiana National Guard Nighthawk Educator Award in 2000 and in 2006.

Throughout her tenure as a representative, Rep. McNamara continues to advocate for pro-business polices, education and the creation of a better Hoosier state. She lives in Evansville with her dog Mercury.

# **From Your Legislation Chair**

The current state legislative session has been even more contentious than usual. The state has surplus tax revenue from last year, and they are required to refund part of it to us taxpayers and to put part into state retirement funds. The legislature is arguing about how to spend the rest of it. Our school systems obviously need more money; schools have frequently been called off due to lack of teachers and/or bus drivers. Controversial legislation has also been which would require teachers to make their lesson plans available to parents in advance. Our editor agrees with me that such a requirement would be ridiculous. Other proposed legislation would require school board candidates to declare their party affiliation. Please let your legislator know what you think about these proposals.

School board elections will be coming up in early May, soon after State Convention. Some school board meetings have been as contentious as the legislature this year, with arguments about Critical Race Theory, Covid masks and closure policies, etc. May will also be the primary election. Some districts have such a strong majority of one party or the other that the primary is the main election for that area. Be sure to vote. Every vote counts!

The name of the winning local organization is inscribed on the Miriam Sturgeon Award plaque, a 24" x 20" framed parchment scroll. The local also receives a \$25 monetary award.

For those of you who are wondering who Miriam Sturgeon was, here is a brief bio:

Miriam (Meloy) Sturgeon was born in Waldron, Indiana, on August 27, 1916. Her father was a printer. This fact not only shaped her life, but it also influenced the lives of thousand of others. Her journalistic talents and loves drove her to great achievements. She earned both Bachelor and Masters degrees in journalism from Indiana University. While completing her Masters, she organized a journalism library at the university. She eventually became administrative associate for the Indiana University Foundation. Miriam was instrumental in raising more than \$1 million for the remodeling of Ernie Pyle Hall. She raised several other millions of dollars for her Alma Mater.

Miriam was editor of the Hoosier Business Woman from 1968-75. She also served the federation as Fall Conference Coordinator whenever the conference was held at IU. A member of Brown County BPW, Miriam also served INFBPW as State Historian and Public Relations Chair. In 1973, she established the Ida Anderson Award which went to the local which best publicized its activities through printed media.

Miriam was a champion of women's rights. She worked diligently for ratification of the Equal Rights Amendment. Miriam (Meloy) Sturgeon died on January 14, 1979.
